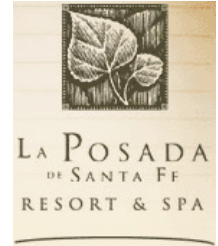

Location / Airports:

Santa Fe is located in northern New Mexico, just an hour's drive north of Albuquerque, which is now the state's largest city and major gateway. [The Albuquerque International Sunport](#), as the airport is officially known, is serviced by all of the major U.S. airlines.

Flying into Albuquerque and renting a car is by far the most popular way to travel around New Mexico, but not the only way. [Santa Fe Municipal Airport is serviced by a commuter airline connection but is also open to private aircraft.](#) Train and bus services provide access to New Mexico on a daily basis. Shuttle service is available from the Albuquerque airport, Santa Fe airport, and the train station located in Lamy, New Mexico (about 20 miles from Santa Fe).

Santa Fe's own municipal airport, in the southwestern corner of the city, handles all types of private aircraft. Commuter service into and out of Santa Fe is provided by American Eagle.

What is the altitude of Santa Fe and how will that affect me?

Santa Fe is located in the foothills of the Sangre de Cristo Mountains, at approximately 7,000 feet above sea level. Adapting to high altitude can take a few days. Drinking extra water can help. High altitude also means faster sunburns. Sunscreen and a hat are recommended.
